
## Student Investor Challenge

York Campus have been taking part in a prestigious event run by the London Institute of Banking and Finance. This involves teams investing a virtual £100,000 in shares and commodities. Out of 30,000 students starting the competition in phase 1, these were reduced down to 500 teams to compete in the semi-finals of predicting share price movements.

York Campus managed to achieve two teams reaching the semi-finals. Currently the teams are occupying 1st and 109th out of 500 teams. In 1st place at the moment is the team - Colin the Cow which includes Kirby Frizelle, Pierre Frizelle, Owen Johnston and Fred Trevvett. Cereal Killer at 109th includes Trudi Ellis, Telfer Jackson, Sophie Ledgeway and Riley Mytton. This is a fantastic achievement against some of the top independent and state schools in the country.

The competition is due to reach phase 3 soon with the top 8 teams invited down to the City of London for the grand final. Congratulations to both our teams and making the final would be an amazing achievement!
